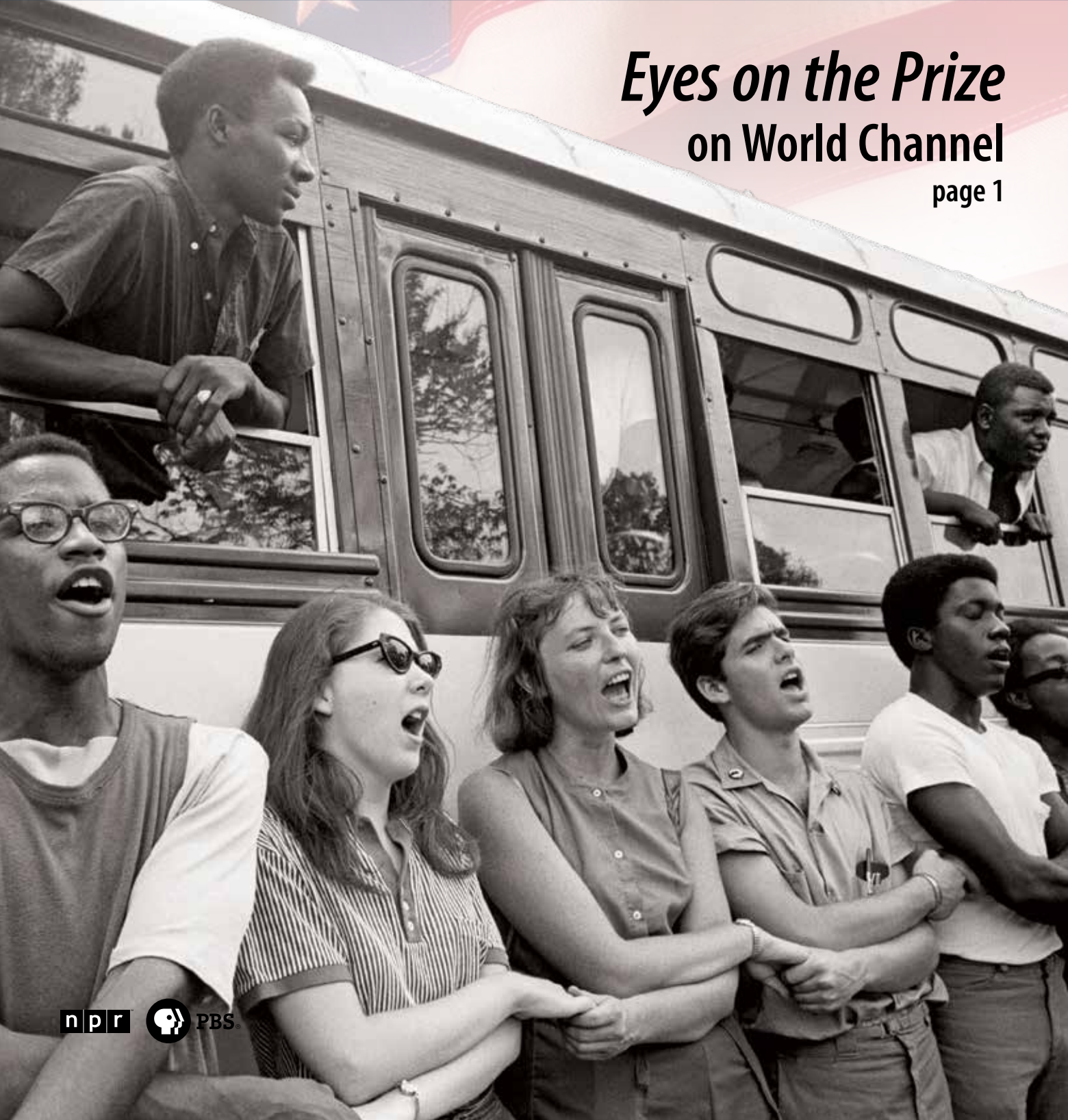

Eyes on World

Almost three decades after first presenting Henry Hampton's *Eyes on the Prize* to the nation, WGBH is bringing the landmark documentary series to a new generation of public television viewers on our national programming service, World Channel. The history that *Eyes* captures and the lessons it powerfully conveys are more relevant than ever.

"By telling the stories of the ordinary men and women who fought the early battles in the civil rights movement, *Eyes on the Prize* can help inform and elevate the national discussion on race relations in America," says **Liz Cheng**, WGBH's general manager for television. "Young people today—from first-time voters to students protesting on college campuses across the country—can witness how far we've come, in order to see where we have yet to go."



Produced by Blackside Inc., *Eyes on the Prize* recounts the fight to end decades of discrimination and segregation—beginning in 1954 and continuing over

14 episodes to the mid-1980s. It chronicles the individuals, forces and events that changed the fabric of American life.

World—the WGBH-curated channel for documentary, nonfiction and journalism series and films—began its rebroadcast last month with *Then and Now*, a new 30-minute retrospective that examines *Eyes* and its impact today. The series continues every Sunday at 8pm on World (see sidebar: Where to Tune In), and additional content, including the *Then and Now* special and short videos about the series, can be streamed online at **Worldchannel.org**.

Eyes on the Prize is one of many programs we're featuring in recognition of Black History Month (page 23). Award-winning filmmaker Stanley Nelson's *The Black Panthers: Vanguard of the Revolution* (page 14) is the first feature-length documentary to explore the Black Panther Party.

"The Black Panthers made an indelible imprint on American culture and politics," Nelson says. "The story of their rise and fall is essential history for understanding the times we live in, and the complicated political dynamics that are still at play."

This month and every month, WGBH brings you stories like these that connect us to our shared past and shed new light on the critical issues of our present. And we can do so thanks to your generous annual support.

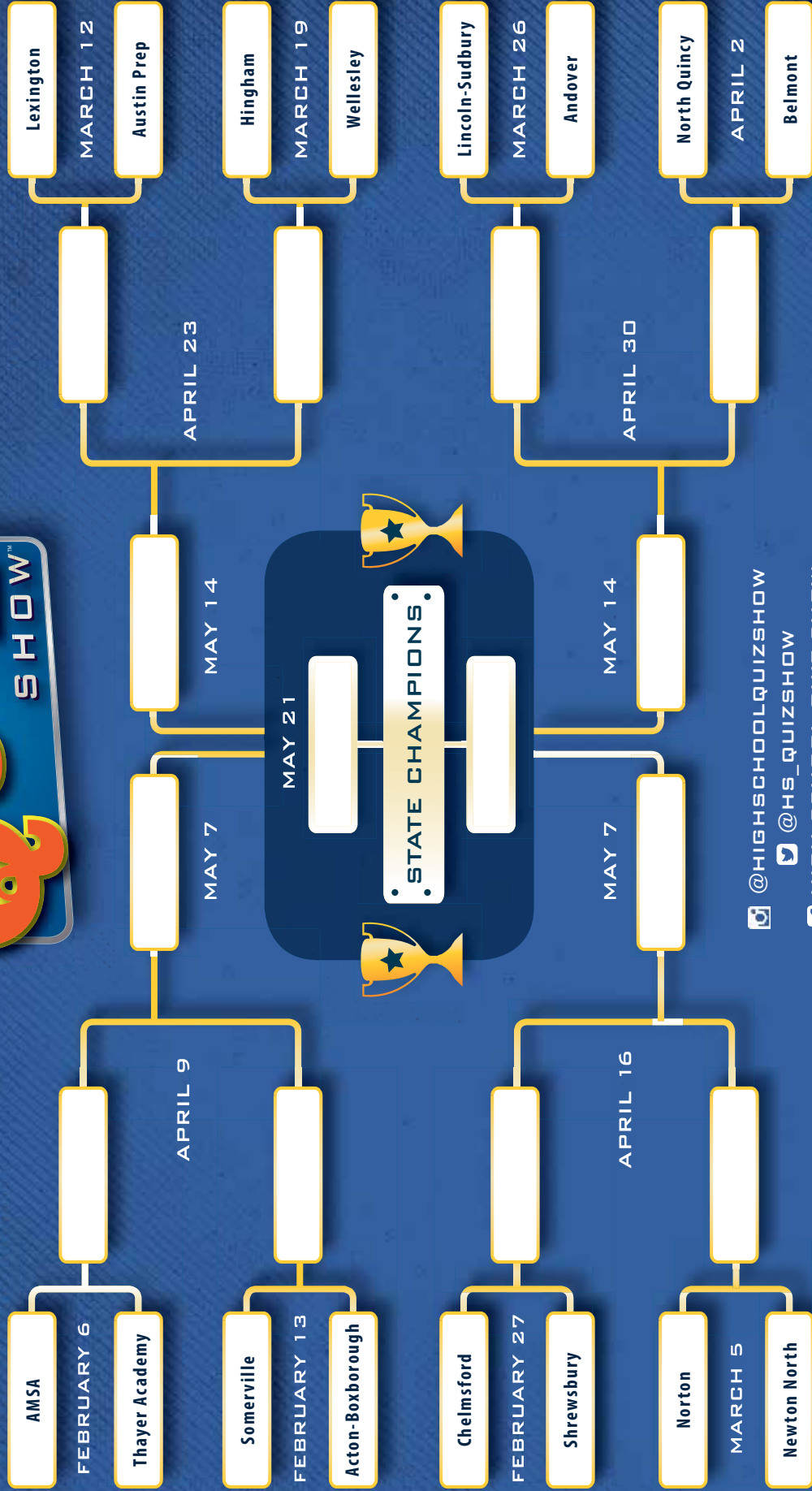



Demand for drugs in America has never been higher. Twenty-three million Americans are abusing drugs, and overdoses kill 40,000 people a year—more than car accidents. Half of the country's prison population—the largest in the world—is serving time for drug offenses. The civil rights movement discovers the power of mass demonstrations as the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. emerges as its most visible leader. Some demonstrations succeed; others fail. But the triumphant March on Washington, D.C., under King's leadership, shows a mounting national support for civil rights. The series continues every Sunday night, culminating in a six-episode marathon of *Eyes on the Prize I*, leading up to the prime-time broadcast of the first *Eyes on the Prize II* episode on Feb. 28.

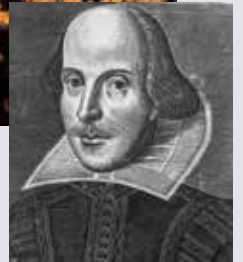
The Bard on WCRB

WCAI's Pelagic Report

The ocean surrounding Cape Cod is a mostly mysterious world teeming with life and activity. WCAI explores what's happening on and under the water in our weekly *Pelagic Report*, featuring experts from the Center for Coastal Studies in Provincetown.

Rich Delaney, the center's president and CEO, says it's a great opportunity to reveal the ever-changing marine and coastal environment to WCAI listeners.

"We're excited to take listeners behind the scenes into our labs and research vessels; to take them with us to the beach to spot rare whales, or to the National Seashore to see the long and short-term effects of sea-level rise on our favorite beaches," Delaney says.

All Things Considered host Steve Junker talks with different researchers each week about everything from marine debris, the whereabouts of whales and disentanglements of marine animals to the amazing sea life nursery in Pleasant Bay.

"Every week I learn something new," Junker says. "I didn't know that scientists aren't sure where right whales are going when they leave Cape Cod Bay, or that most of the trash on our shorelines comes not in summer, when the beaches are so busy, but in the spring and winter, washing up from elsewhere in big storms."



The Center for Coastal Studies is immersed in some of the most pressing issues facing our inshore waters and the local marine environment, and researchers there have great stories to tell.

"I've always wondered what it

must be like to ride out in a small boat to free an entangled whale," Junker says. "I spoke with Scott Landry, who described for our listeners the whole process of doing just that, saving a 30-ton humpback that was caught in a buoy line and unable to swim. By the end, I felt like I went along—and I didn't even have to get wet!"
