## An Irresistible Story

We begin the month with a trip to Martha's Vineyard, where WGBH's *Nova* reveals how the historic Gay Head Lighthouse escaped disaster.

Perched high on the cliffs at the western edge of the island, the 400-ton, 52-foot-tall brick structure was precipitously close to toppling into the ocean—standing just 46 feet away from the fragile, eroding shoreline. *Operation Lighthouse Rescue* (page 10) captures the race to save this local treasure.



"Whether it's building a bridge or skyscraper, or in this case, moving an iconic landmark to safety, *Nova* viewers love challenging engineering projects," says WGBH's **Paula Apsell**, senior executive producer of *Nova*. "They love an inside view of experts at work, and seeing the problem solving that goes into overcoming the obstacles they encounter."

From the filmmakers behind *Sunken Ship Rescue*—*Nova*'s 2015 film about raising and re-floating the shipwrecked *Costa Concordia*—*Operation Lighthouse Rescue* chronicles the light's tension-filled, 130-foot journey inland that took place last spring.

But the "how" is just one part of this adventure. There's also the "why," and the film explores the causes of erosion, including the stronger storms and elevated sea level linked to climate change.

And then there is the history of the 160-year-old lighthouse, which, at the height of the whaling trade and still today, serves as a vital navigational guide for recreational and commercial vessels. You learn that it's the only lighthouse with a longstanding history of Native American lighthouse keepers, as members of the Wampanoag Tribe have played an important role in maintaining the light over the years.

"*Operation Lighthouse Rescue* is just a cracking good story about a place that means a lot to those of us from this area," Paula says. "How could we resist telling it?"

I'm glad *Nova* didn't, because it exemplifies what the series does better than anyone on television: demystify science and engineering in an imaginative, accessible and entertaining way. And Paula and her team can do it, year after year, thanks to your generous annual support.

# Rescue Mission

On the picturesque bluffs at the very tip of Martha's Vineyard, disaster loomed. The historic 160-year-old Gay Head Lighthouse was soon to become the next victim of the ocean's relentless, land-gobbling appetite. When built in 1854, the 400-ton structure stood 250 feet away from the 100-foot high cliff edge. But over the years, fierce storms eroded the headland away, leaving the light precipitously close to toppling into the ocean. Its fate depended upon an epic rescue carried out by a team of engineers—they had to move the iconic red-brick structure

130-feet inland to safety. Get an up-close look at the geology and archeology they discovered, and the technology they employed, as they raced to save this historic landmark.

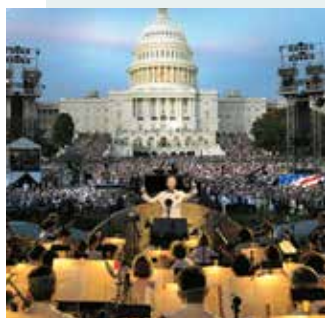

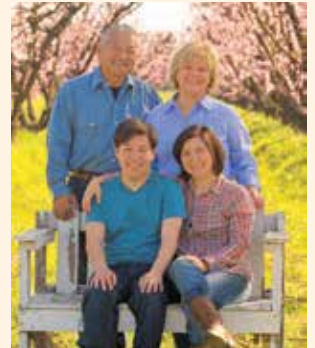


## The Family Farm

through which stories are presented and told. We worked closely with NPR to construct a conference that addressed these challenges."

WGBH News and its partners at the New England Center for Investigative Reporting and the GroundTruth Project, a nonprofit that is training a new generation of foreign correspondents, participated in sessions that emphasized audio storytelling, but included lessons that applied for online and television reporting as well. The NPR team shared insights on newsroom diversity, and worked with WGBH News to explore how awareness of diversity issues impacts storytelling, sourcing and the voices used on air. The sessions also dealt with how to handle controversial issues and the best ways to use social media as a source for stories.



"At every level of the newsroom, and for every platform we serve, this was an important training opportunity," Redo says. "We're confident it will strengthen the in-depth local coverage that we bring our listeners and viewers."

It's been called the Merry Month of May. . . and if you listen to WCRB, it will be just that. Let's begin with a look at what's happening at night, when you're getting home and need to unwind.

WCRB host Alan McLellan describes our evening programming this way: "The *Symphony at 8* sets the tone—it's a chance to focus in on one special piece at a time as the distractions of the day fade away. And then the evening spreads out, with music you can put on to make you feel comfortable, kind of like stepping into a great pair of slippers."

This month, *Symphony at 8* starts with a week dedicated to two birthday celebrants: Brahms and Tchaikovsky, who were both born on May 7. Tuesday through Friday, we will alternate Brahms and Tchaikovsky symphonies, giving you a chance to hear four of the greatest symphonies all in a row, along with a Boston Symphony encore broadcast Saturday, May 7, that includes Tchaikovsky's First Symphony, led by Music Director Andris Nelsons! We'll also mark the birthday of another noteworthy composer, Karl Goldmark, on May 18, with a recording of his *Rustic Wedding Symphony*.



May also brings with it the return of the **Boston Pops**, and we have some exciting performances in store for you. On Saturday, May 21, at 8pm, let WCRB take you to the movies with *Film Night*, conducted by John Williams and **Keith Lockhart**. Then, on

Saturday, May 28, and again on Monday, May 30—Memorial Day Weekend—the Pops will delight you with a celebration of Gershwin, featuring soprano Nicole Cabell.



Now, Memorial Day Weekend also marks the unofficial start to summer, and WCRB, as part of our ongoing #ClassicalAnywhere campaign will draw attention to the ubiquity of classical music you hear in the world—outside of concert halls or on the radio. We will be playing all the music our listeners have noted in their daily lives, from pieces mentioned in books and recognized in commercials to the piece that host Cathy Fuller's washing machine plays when it finishes a cycle.

## Exchange Program

WCAI in Woods Hole, MA, and Marfa Public Radio in rural West Texas are separated by 2,300 miles. One station lies next to an ocean, the other sits in a desert. But thanks to a public media exchange experiment called **Radio Hometown: Two Stations, Two Hosts, One Community of Listeners**, we're going to bridge this gap.



Since then, he's been working with Tom Michael, general manager of Marfa Public Radio.

For three weeks this spring, WCAI's **Steve Junker** will travel to Marfa to host *Morning Edition*, while Travis Bubenik of Marfa Public Radio will head to Woods Hole to host *All Things Considered*. The two hosts have a clear mission: spark conversation across what sometimes appears to be a divisive gap within our national culture, while reflecting the characters and concerns of their local communities.

Junker came up with the idea of an exchange program more than a year ago.

"We want this project to be a chance to expand our definitions of community, to share our stories more widely, and to grow our sense of connection by learning more about each other—letting Massachusetts talk to Texas, the desert talk to the Cape," Junker says.

The project will run from mid April through the first week of May. "The similarities between our stations and the communities they serve are important," Junker adds. "Glancing at a map, you might think we don't have much in common. But we're both small stations serving end-of-the-road communities."

The two stations will document the process throughout and make their findings available to other public media groups interested in replicating the project.

"At conferences, most of us get to see the big stations," Michael says. "They do amazing work and pull us into the future. But in my experience, fascinating things are happening on the fringes. That's why this host exchange interests me. What can we do better with our staff size, in our market, for our listeners? I want to find out."
